

July 7th 1857

Dear Father and Mother as we have not received any letters from ~~any~~ you i thought i would write a few lines to let you know that we are all well and enjoying ourselves as well as we can away from all of our friends and relatives and among strangers and i hope these few lines may find you all the same i ~~want~~^{would} to hear that Mother's health was better than when we left we have written so many letters that i cant write much we have very warm weather here we have got our wheat almost cut it will take two days more i can cut ~~it~~ its first rate it is higher than Ganson can reach our garden is better than any in that part of the country Tell Henry that Ganson wrote him a letter and wa to tell Enos that if he sells his farm not to buy til he comes out here and see the place tel Chasen and Eunice that when they come to see their folks to come and see us for we have got a plenty to eat tel Asa and Emily not to forget their promises next summer for we shall look for them tel Henry and Sarah that when they want to take a ride on the cars just come up and see us tel Emily McNeal that when they come to the west to come and see us for it is a pleasant trip up their Father we should like to have you come and see where we live and see if Ganson did not make a better chois than James did for i think we have got a much better farm than we had than tel James that when he goes to the west to come where he can go without a boat Mother we should be glad to see you but that cannot be so we will send our best love to you and all the rest write soon
