

Berlin June 5<sup>th</sup>

Dear and respected Father You

letter dated June 1<sup>st</sup> came last night and found us  
well I was very glad to hear from home and glad to  
hear that you were all well and prosperous I would  
like to help Cawdy if it is possible I think we will try and  
send him something before long If he was here we could  
place ~~photograph~~ him in a situation where he could get a start  
after a while money with us is rather scarce and  
hard to get Harvey has not got entirely out of  
our debt but by prudent management he expects to  
be before many years Although he did not lose all  
who has passed through trials that I should not wish  
to see before an enemy much less a friend or  
relative But that it is desirable to have an  
abundance of this world's goods I do not think  
it is right to use all our energies of body and mind  
trying to lay up property as I think we have <sup>done</sup> too done  
much for the good of our minds We hear from  
Hollis once in about two or three weeks when we  
last heard from him he was in Arkansas 100  
miles from Memphis Tennessee and 90 from  
Little Rock where they were going I suppose they  
are there by this time Hollis writes that he has  
enjoyed good health all the time and that he  
likes a soldier's life but I think he will be glad to  
return to peaceful employment which I hope he  
may soon They took a Seesah Printing office at

Jacksonport, and started a paper Hollis was  
employed in the office while they were there he  
says he expects to be permanently situated in  
it when they get to Little Rock I hope he may  
as it will be easier and safer than marching  
he has been in the Courant office in Berlin and  
understands setting type pretty well. But I hope  
this dreadful war will soon close so they can  
all return home to enjoy the peace of former days  
It is a sad sight to see soldiers round the  
streets on crutches as there have been quite a  
number here since the battle at Pittsburg Landing,  
while the funeral sermons of others have been  
preached and others still that belong here are  
prisoners
