Dear Father

Your Letter of the 9th came duly to hand. I have been very busy working in the Harvest field, blazing & other work, & have not felt much like writing letters, for some time past. We are all in comfortable health. Friedrich's knee, about which you enquire, is so that he can get around tolerably well; but may require amputation ultimately. The pay on our Lot was due in June. I could not pay anything towards it then. It got the same extended until Fall. You need not urge any of the Friends to assist us any more: if they have no duty in that direction, we do not wish them to put themselves out of the way to assist us more. We shall doubtless get through the world some way and

hope to come out right at the
end of the journey; Still, I believe
my brethren who are able, would
feel better themselves if they
would manifest a little more
Brotherly Kindness. They are not
devoid the possibility of being in-
different some time, in some way
to may need help in some form
or other, from some one. There in-
deed sometimes strange things happen
even in a short lifetime.
If circumstances with them & me
were exactly reversed, perhaps they
would view the matter a little
differently from what they now
do. God bless em, I believe you
are ashamed of them; & I know
I am.
