We are better fixed for getting through the Winter than we have been for the three or 4 years past. & If I have my health we shall do very well, as there is no lack <sup>now</sup> for chance to work at something or other. So I think you will not need to send us any more money. We are certainly much obliged for assistance you have rendered us: as it has been really a relief to us, on several occasions. & we appreciate it the more knowing as we do, that it has been bestowed cheerfully. I think the prospect is quite favorable that we may get, get, tolerably well located, & gradually get something ahead again.

I received a letter from Hollis a few days ago stating that he was at St Louis, at the Hospital, & that he would likely get a furlough soon & would stop to see us on his way home.

Cool weather seems to be commencing quite early this fall, for this latitude: as we have had several frosts & cold rain storms.
