Dear Father,

Your Letter of the second, is received. I am glad to learn that you continue in health &c. We are all in tolerable health. Fredrick knee of which you enquire is getting quite straight. & so that he runs about quite handily. Francis, Emma, & Berd, constitute our family now living.

Malvinda's health is getting better. Since she has got over her Measles Cough.

The most of the settlers have lately come into this part of the country. It is 20 miles to a Blowing Mill, one way & 30 the other. Cows are worth from 20 to \$30. Oxen from \$100. to 125 per yoke.

Horses from 125 to 150 apiece.
There is a considerable gain within
8 or 10 miles, now in stack.
Wheat ^{at} 100 Corn & Potatoes about
50 cts per Bush.

Water can be had by digging
from 12 to 20 feet. There is no
Stream on either of my $\frac{1}{4}$ sects.
I am now at work putting
up Hay on the $\frac{1}{4}$. I am
living on, which will doubtless
bring something before winter
in over with. Some places
I think will go 2 tons, to the
Acre, on low spots.

My Religious enjoyment continuing
good. I think we shall have
preaching within reach
next Summer after we get
a new School House.
