health. - are getting a very cool
Summer so far; rather too much
for corn to grow much; but Wheat
is doing finely & bids fair for a
bountiful crop. It is expected
that the R. Road will be in operation
within about 4 miles of us this fall
which will make a good deal of differ-
ence in drawing off grain from this
part of the County; 30 miles now
to the Station.

Frances is teaching the District School
this Summer. Frederic & Emma are
attending & are doing well in their
studies. I am turning over some
of the Prairie getting ready for
raising a crop next Season.

It must certainly have been
a very great trial for Genson to
lose his money after having been
gone so long, & have to return
again, instead of coming home.
But we do not always know
what is best for us in the long
run.

Minnesota Lake Village is getting to
large enough to have shows, stop
now & then. There is to be an Indian
Show there to day. They are on their
way East & will probably attract big
crowds there, where Indians are scarce.
There are folks in this State however
who would about as leave shoot
an Indian as to eat their breakfast.

Corn is now only about 8 inches high smaller
than I have known it before at this time
of year. Some pieces of Barley are heading out.
