

Wells, Veribault Co Minn.

May 15th 1870.

Dear Brother.

I improve the present leisure, to send a few lines. We are all in comfortable health. Spring has been a little more backward than usual. Wheat sowing is nearly done now but some are sowing Oats yet. The Town is building up gradually, has the appearance of making a quite a business place. Religious is rather low notwithstanding we have preaching quite often now. Perhaps owing to the lack of prayer as there has been no prayer meeting commenced in the place yet. A Sunday School has just

been started, likewise a
day school.

There has not been much
emigration into this part
of the State yet, this
Spring - perhaps may
be a considerable thing
the summer, on a good many
more with teams by wagon and
wait until feed gets a good
start. Grazing is up now so
that cattle do well on
the prairie. Wheat is
selling low but a great
amount has been down
in expectation of a
higher price in the fall.
Some are turning their
attention to stock raising
which may pay better.
