Dear Father,

Your Letter to
Emma came duly to hand.
We are all in usual health &
having some pretty hot weather
just about these days. Barley
is now being harvested. Wheat
& Oats will do in course of
10 days. Crops are very good in
this section. The Snow is
not growing as rapidly as it
did last Summer owing to
the close trim in money
market in this locality
which will continue most likely
until the present crop is
marketed. The Steam Plow
proved rather a failure &
is laid by for the present.
It is calculated that Seat

- for fuel, will be a success.
Six Men, with Steam Engine
& machinery are now getting
it out at quite a rapid rate
to run the Engine on the
Rail Road & Supply those
who may lack gas fuel
next Winter. A good
many are contracting for fruit
trees from the agent of an
Illinois Nursery, trees to be
delivered here this fall in
time to set. Many are quite
danguine that the Hardier
varieties of Apple Pear & Cherry
&c will yet be successfully
grown in this locality.

Religious Matters are at rather
a low state. There is a
good attendance at the Sabbath
school, over 100. I have in
the neighborhood of 100 Copies

of the Earnest Christian on
hand, which you sent to
us. These I think of distributing
to the Scholars next Sabbath.
Possibly the Money you have
invested for them, may be blessed
to the Spiritual good of many
families, into whose hands
they may fall. We have
read them attentively, & Esteem
them high. The Free Methodist
is also a most excellent religious
paper of the right stamp.

A new Presbyterian Church is
now in progress of Building
here - to cost about \$200.
The Methodists hold their
services in the School house
& probably will not undertake to
build for a year or so yet.
