

Tonawanda April 29 - 1872

Father Dear Sir we received your very kind letter and in reply say we are quite well at present Ann was sick about two weeks this spring she has got her health quite good again she has attended Church quite regular through the winter thinks she has been profited by so doing spiritually, which I suppose you will be glad to learn. She would be glad to have you come and make her a visit she expresses herself much pleased in regard to the present you spoke of having for her. Says you could not have suited her better she thinks the better way I will be to save it until it can be brought directly home for fear it might

get lost. She is anxious to have me come down which I should have done before this if it had not been for the disappointment I mentioned to you I am waiting to see what he will do about it. The town has elected me Constable again perhaps to my disadvantage dont know it serves to keep me from other business although out of it I can make a living by working our acre of ground which is in a very good shape this season I have planted potatoes Corn & sown a quantity of smaller seeds. I may have occasion to come down officially before long cant tell for sure.

Rand, is dead he lived on farm  
down the River dont know as  
you new him. There has been  
quite a good deal of sickness  
and is get. Scarled and spotted  
fever. There is to be a large  
amount of improvement on  
our side of creek this summer  
That from Buffalo will build  
large iron works, a Company is  
formed to build an extensive  
manufacturing ~~manufadu~~  
establisment of woodwork  
about 75 acres of land has been  
purchased to build upon down the  
river adjoining the village, great  
talk of great things being done  
besides bridging the river at this  
point and taking out the dam  
acrost the creek.

I think I will have an opportunity to work if I am well which I hope I may be I think it will be good for me have been resting a good while, I think you had better come and make a visit - before the hot weather comes on, you will please give my love to all the Boys and galls of our folks and excuse the style of this letter.
